

DEVOTION:

"For God gave us a spirit not of fear but of power and love and self-control." — 2 Timothy 1:7

Reflection:

Bold love and service aren't about having loud personalities, impressive platforms, or heroic gestures. At their core, they're about living from the Spirit of God — not out of fear, but from the courage, love, and discipline He provides.

Jesus modeled this perfectly. His love was fearless — touching lepers, forgiving sinners, confronting religious hypocrisy, and ultimately laying down His life. He didn't wait until people deserved love or begged for help. He saw needs and acted. Boldly.

Sacrificially. Compassionately.

We often hesitate — fearing rejection, discomfort, or inadequacy. But boldness in Christ doesn't come from self-confidence; it comes from *God-confidence*. When we love and serve in His strength, He multiplies our small acts of obedience into Kingdom impact.

How to Love and Serve Boldly:

1. Remember who empowers you.

You don't serve in your own strength. God has given you His Spirit — full of power, love, and self-control. Rely on Him daily.

2. Refuse to be ruled by fear.

Fear tells you to play it safe. Love calls you to step out. Say yes even when it feels risky — whether it's praying for someone, forgiving an enemy, or serving outside your comfort zone.

3. Start small, stay faithful.

Boldness isn't always big. It's consistent. It's showing up, choosing love over apathy, and serving even when no one sees.

4. Look to Jesus.

The more you fix your eyes on Him, the less intimidating everything else becomes. His love fills you so you can pour it out boldly.
